SHOW REGULATIONS

1. EXHIBITORS

- a) The prizes offered for exhibits in this schedule are open to everyone unless otherwise stated. Exhibitors must comply with the Show Regulations.
- b) Directors of the Society may exhibit, except in a class of which that Director is Convener.
- c) Non members will have free entry for exhibits and will be required to pay entry fee at the gate.

2. EXHIBITS

- a) Horticultural exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor and must have been in his possession for two months prior to the
- b) Exhibits must be disease and pest free.
- c) The Directors reserve the right to visit and examine the gardens and premises from which the exhibits have been entered for the
- d) In Floral Art Classes, plant material need not be grown by the exhibitor but must be arranged and staged by the exhibitor in the marquee unless otherwise stated.

3. ENTRIES

- a) Exhibitors are allowed two entries per class except in classes 310 323, 365 390, where only one entry is permitted.
- b) Entries, on the form provided, should be lodged with the Show Secretary by 7.30am on the Saturday of the Show. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Show Manager, except in the case of classes 1, 69 -76,198, 200, 201 and 310 323, which must be received by 8pm on the TUESDAY preceding the Show. No late entries will be accepted in these classes.
- c) The Directors reserve to themselves the right to refuse any entry.
- d) An exhibitor, unable to stage an entry, should advise the Secretary as soon as possible.
- e) Entries by email will be accepted. All entries received by email will be acknowledged by the Show Secretary within 24hours. If no confirmation email is received the entry has not been lodged. It is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure exhibits are entered.

It is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure entries have been received by the Show Secretary.

4. EXHIBITOR'S CARDS

- a) These should be collected from the Secretary's Show Office, each exhibit to have one card which will be placed with the name downwards. Classes with multiple pots will require 1 card for each pot. Please note on entry form.
- b) Cards altered in any way by an exhibitor will lead to disqualification.
- c) If no card placed on an exhibit by exhibitor, steward will place a blank card.

5. EXHIBITOR'S LIFTING CARDS

a) These should be collected by exhibitors at the time of staging and only holders of such cards will be allowed in the marquee during staging and for the removal of exhibits. In addition, lifting cards for assistants will be available upon request at the Secretary's Office. Lifting cards do not admit to show.

6. STAGING

- a) All Exhibitors must verify entries with the Secretary BEFORE staging.
- b) All exhibits for competition must be staged between 12 noon on Friday prior to show and 7.45am on the Saturday morning of show. All exhibitors and their assistants must leave the marquee by 7.45am on Saturday morning.
- c) Exhibits should be correctly named as far as known.
- d) No trade cards will be allowed on any of the exhibits.
- e) Exhibitors must show in their own boxes, stands, bowls etc except where specified otherwise in the schedule boxed, etc, to be in keeping.
- f) All vases used must be supplied by the Society. Alternative sizes may be issued.
- g) All cut flowers and shrubs must be shown in water. Exhibitors are requested to water their plants during the show.

6. Continued

- h) The Show will be staged and judged in accordance with the Rules in the current edition of the Royal Horticultural Society's publication "The Horticultural Show Handbook" (copy available in Secretary's Show Office) supplemented by the Rules of Specialist Societies. Exhibitors should note the difference between "kind" and "variety". Exhibitors must follow the direction of the Show Manager regarding staging.
- i) Kinds Flowers (example) 3 vases annuals could be Asters, Marigolds, Nigella

Varieties - Flowers (example) could be Roses - My Love, Super Sun, Silver Jubilee

Kinds - Vegetables (example) could be Carrots, Beetroot, Leeks

Kinds - Shrubs (example) would be Buddlia, Hydrangea, Spirea

7. JUDGING

- a) Only Officials will be allowed in the marquees during judging.
- b) Judging will take place between 8am and 11am on the Saturday of the Show,
- c) Any exhibit which is not according to schedule will be disqualified.
- d) The decision of the judges shall be final on the relative merit of the exhibits, but the Directors reserve to themselves the decision on any other points in dispute.
- e) Prizes or trophies may be withheld when exhibits are deficient in quality or condition.

8. PROTESTS

- a) Protests or complaints upon any grounds must be lodged with the Secretary in writing by 2pm on the first day of the show.
- b) Anyone lodging a protest must be able to demonstrate, before the close of the show, that he will be able to substantiate the same, else the protest will not be entertained and the exhibitor making the protest will be found liable for payment of all expenses incurred.
- c) Any prize, found to have been unfairly obtained, will be forfeited and if any article is discovered to have been tampered with for the purpose of deception the exhibitor of such, besides being exposed will forfeit all his prize money and be liable to expulsion.

9. TROPHIES

- a) In computing points gained towards the award of a trophy, £2.50 or less 5 points for first place, 3 points for second place and 2 points for third place will be given if the first prize is £5.00 10 points, for first place, 6 points for second place, and 4 points for third place. If first place is £7.50 15 points for first place, 9 points for second place and 6 point for third place will be given, if the first place is £10 20points,for first place, 12 points for second place 8 points for third place. If first place is £15.00 30 points for first place, 18 points for second place, 12 points for third place.
- b) Trophies for most points will only be awarded if there is an outright winner. In the case of two or more competitors having the same points the award will go to the one with the most first prizes, failing that the one with the most second prizes.
- c) Winners of Trophies, or their representatives, should be present to receive them at 2.30pm on the Sunday of the Show.
- d) Trophies MUST NOT be placed on stands beside exhibits and winners are responsible for the care of trophies while in their possession.
- e) Trophies are to be retained for one year only, unless otherwise stated.
- f) The trophies are insured by the Society against all risks anywhere in the United Kingdom, and the Secretary must be notified in writing immediately in the event of any trophy being damaged, lost, destroyed or stolen.
- g) Trophies, and their protective bags, should be returned to the Trophy Convenor not later than the last Saturday in July.

10. PRIZE MONEY

- a) Prize money will be paid in the Treasurer's Show Office between 12pm 4.30pm on the Sunday of the Show. Any amount over £20.00 can be paid by bank transfer. Bank details must be supplied.
- b) Any prize money not collected by 4,30pm at the show must be claimed within 7 days from the treasurer and a stamped addressed envelope must accompany the claim. Money not so claimed will be regarded as a donation to the Society.

11. REMOVAL

- a) No exhibit is to be removed before 5pm on the Sunday of the Show.
- b) The marquee will be cleared of everyone except the Society's Officials at 5pm on the Sunday of the Show.
- c) Exhibitors and assistants will be admitted to remove exhibits only on production of a lifting card between 5.05pm and 5.35pm.
- d) No exhibits can be delivered up except to the exhibitor personally or on his written order.
- e) Any exhibit left after 5.40pm will be the property of the Society.

Community Garden Challenge Shield

This challenge is open to any clubs, schools or youth organisations or individuals to create a small display garden in the allotted space. The display can be used to promote the community group by providing a decorative horticultural exhibit with a title.

Rules.

- 1. An exhibitors card MUST be placed with name downwards on exhibit.
- 2. The exhibit must not exceed 1.1metre width x 1.1 metre depth (outside measurement) and the height must not exceed 2 metres measured from the ground.
- 3. The exhibit should be designed to be viewed from a distinguishable front.
- 4. The use of a backdrop is permitted within the stated dimensions.
- 5. The exhibit must comprise of predominantly living plant material with hard soft landscaping components such as rock, stone, ornaments or other props being kept to a minimum. Artificial plant material is not permitted.

HINTS FOR THE SHOW BENCH

VEGETABLES

- 1. Clean vegetables by holding them under a cold water tap using a sponge to remove the soil. Never use a brush.
- 2. Never use any oily substance to clean vegetables. Occasionally carrots are cleaned with butter, but it is easily seen and a judge will down point them.
- 3. Where a root vegetable is white it is advisable to leave lifting to the very last moment, particularly in the case of parsnips.
- 4. Consider size when showing potatoes. Balance your exhibit with tubers uniform in size, free from blemish and typical of the variety.
- 5. When showing a collection, arrange your box so that the vegetables are presented in the best possible combination of colour and size.
- 6. Present your vegetables with the best side to the judge, first impressions can help a lot in the final decision.

FLOWERS

- 1. All flowers should be shown when they are at the peak of their flowering and not looking tired.
- 2. Pull a day early and immerse the stems in water up to and almost touching the flowers. This makes certain the stems are fully charged with water and that no "flagging" takes place.
- 3. Present the vase so that as much of the flower as possible can be seen by the judge.
- 4. Never crowd a vase by gripping the stems together.
- 5. When showing a number of vases together give them space so that they can be seen.
- 6. Remove all damaged petals and damaged leaves.

POT PLANTS

- 1. Show in the correct size of pot.
- 2. Make certain the pots are washed.
- 3. A pot plant is judged on the quality of its foliage as well as flower.
- 4. Stake to show plant to best advantage, but hide stakes as much as possible.

FRUIT

- 1. Show fruit of good colour and form.
- 2. Fruit should be firm in texture.
- 3. The use of Virginia Creeper leaves placed on the plate helps the presentation of the fruit.

GENERAL

- 1. Read the rules of your schedule carefully. Allow yourself plenty of time to stage the exhibits.
- 2. Before leaving, count the number of blooms, fruit or vegetables in each receptacle and make sure that they are according to schedule.
- 3. If in doubt consult the Convener or Show Manager, whose help could save you from being disqualified.
